Course description:

The programme of the IPNA/ESPN Teaching Course in Pediatric Nephrology will be involving inherited and acquired chronic kidney diseases with the best practice guidelines and evidence-based medicine recommendations. The morning sessions will include an audience response system about various chronic kidney diseases to make the interactions between the faculty and attending colleagues more effective. Afternoon sessions are intended to bring to the audience basic information and recent advances in diagnosing, treatment and outcome of renal diseases. Later on, during “Meet the expert” pediatric nephrologists will present specific difficult clinical cases corresponding to the morning topics which will be further elaborated and discussed in detail with moderators of the session. Finally, pediatricians will learn about critical appraisal of research in pediatric nephrology.
